She hasn't asked for anything and only does what she is asked to do.

This year we are planning to do something different at school, it is probably our first Christmas event at the Bethany school. We are planning to have a Christmas service, where the children will take part in different activities, for example a nativity play, Christmas songs/ carols. The children are so excited about this event, and it is even more exciting to our village children, this will definitely be something new to them as they have never experienced it before.
